Friday 2

Continues snowing all day
The boys arrived from Peace Camp
with boat they had to leave part
of their loads at the north end
on account of the deep snow
they went for a load of hay
in office

Saturday 3

Continues cold self at odd jobs
George leaving after his trip, the
mail has not arrived

Sunday 4

Mail arrived this morning from Peace
Camp and left again in afternoon
a fine clear day we being around
from up the River

Monday 5

I brought Mr King's furs this morning
self in afternoon cutting fire wood
George handling hay. Mr Beattie
arrived from N Hope he has
brought about \$2000 worth of furs
for Revillon Bros. a fine warm
day blowing a Chinook wind in
afternoon

Tuesday 6

Self & John cutting fire wood
George handling. Dick & Asquith
arrived from Cache Creek this
evening. Blowing a warm wind
all day, but wind changed to the
north and turned cold

Wednesday 7

N Hope brought the parcel from their
house with furs from Graham
self being with Indians a little
colder today
