of Hurders Hope was married  
to day by Chief Constable Pearson  
continuous cold

Sunday 25

a fine clear day but cold  
Beatty left for Hope this morning

Monday 26

continuous cold self & George  
chopping fire wood in the bush  
Pranks & Cadanhead and from  
Paver camp

Tuesday 27

a fine clear day self thrashing the  
oat & barley George handling  
fire wood. W. McQuigall &  
J. Campbell arrived from Spirit  
River with pump etc.

Wednesday 28

a fine clear day self finished  
thrashing George cutting wood  
Porter & Parton arrived and  
brought in their furs and  
saled 1 Silver Fox to Peiser  
and the balance to Howland

March 1917

Thursday 1

self in office a fine clear day  
all the family sick with the cold  
Pranks & Mrs Cadanhead & daughter  
passed here this evening on their  
way to Edmonton

Friday 2

self busy in office a minor  
arrived from the mountains  
and received 3 minor blues  
they continued on their way  
out Mr Taylor was up for a  
few supplies continuous  
fine weather but cloudy  
towards evening and looks  
like snow
