Sunday 5

Very mild a little snow but turned to rain after noon and rained heavily for about 2 hours, wind from North East, but wind changed to west about 8,30 this evening and very mild boy hauled 2 loads feed

Monday 6

A fine clear day but cold I drove up to the Poppier with some mail and I also had dinner at the H.B. the Boys hauled 4 loads of feed cloudy this evening and started to snow the River went down over a ft last night

Tuesday 7

Blowy a strong West wind and very warm the Boys brought 2 loads of feed from Kears place, the wind changed to North after dinner and turned cold, but again went toward the west Willie went home after dinner

Wednesday 8

Cold wind from North East Frank went for a load of Shear from #35 a gas Boat went up the River, no Ice Running Started to snow this evening
